
# HVPS+ quarterly meeting discussion summary

- HVPS+ covered the following high-level topics in its last quarterly meeting:
  - A. Two new co-chairs confirmed from BoE and AusPayNet
  - B. Outcomes of the Change Management Taskforce approved:
    - I. Revised terms of reference
    - I. New change management process
    - II. Next steps in promotion of HVPS+
  - C. Outcome of the Harmonisation Taskforce approved: New payments interoperability charter
  - D. Usage guidelines for 2024 ratified as final
  - E. Approach to development and approval agreed for 2025 usage guidelines



### Outcomes of HVPS+ Change Management Taskforce

- Revised terms of reference
  - Strengthens governance e.g. by:
    - Defining the term and roles and responsibilities of co-chairs
    - Being more prescriptive on voting rights of MI members vs Non-MI members
  - Addresses surge of new member requests
- New change management process
  - Aims at aligning with CBPR+ change management process to maintain and improve interoperability across both groups
- Next steps in promotion of HVPS+
  - Aims primarily at launching of new internet presence to increase HVPS+ visibility as well as for future information sharing

## Outcomes of HVPS+ Harmonisation Taskforce



#### Payments Interoperability Charter

- Aims to foster support from MIs to enable evolution and interoperability through agreed set of objectives and principles and information sharing:
  - Maintaining Usage Guidelines (UGs) aligned to one of the two most recent HVPS+ collections
  - Avoiding unnecessary variation from HVPS+ UGs to maximise interoperability. Where variation is necessary, details and rationale to be shared with HVPS+
  - Being transparent about current message, roadmap or long-term schedule for future UG changes, and any market practice or release notes deemed non-sensitive and sharable

### Support of the charter

 CHAPS and HVCS formally declared their support for the charter during the HVPS+ quarterly meeting

# Next steps

- HVPS+ to create two new task forces to commence work on usage guidelines for 2025
  - First taskforce will focus on:
    - Incorporation of CPMI ISO 20022 data harmonisation requirements
    - Impact assessment of new ISO 20022 base message versions
    - Proposal to combine business application header and payload information
    - Review of possible changes to HVPS message collection
  - Second taskforce will focus on:
    - Review of current HVPS+ MyStandards Group page
- T2 to continue its support to the Payments Interoperability Charter in continuation of the ongoing HVPS+ collaboration
